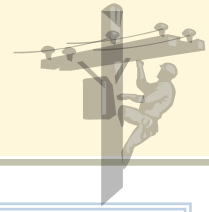

He stated that despite the challenging times of the past 1½ - 2 years, the significant decrease in our net surplus, and conservation measures by many of our customers, SESD has maintained a positive position financially. REBATE PROGRAM Home Energy Savings Program

SESD has partnered with UAMPS (Utah Associated Municipal Power Systems) to offer cash incentives to customers who purchase energy efficient appliances and lighting fixtures from participating retailers.

You can now get cash back when you purchase a qualifying appliance or lighting fixture. Plus you will save money on your energy bill year after year, and help the environment.

Stop Quiet Waste

Many small electronics and appliances consume energy whenever they are plugged in. That's because they remain in standby mode all the time, providing instant start-up, digital clocks, and memory features. You can simply unplug some of this equipment when not in use. When you shop, decide how many of these features you really need, and shop for Energy Star-labeled electronics. These provide advanced features with up to 60 percent energy savings.

Cell phone chargers and power adapters for MP3 players, cameras, laptops, and other devices waste energy, too, when they are plugged in but not in use. All told, the 1.5 billion power adapters in the U.S. now account for more than 10 percent of the national electric bill-and all these numbers are on the rise! You can look for energy-efficient power adapters or just remember to unplug them when they are not in use.
