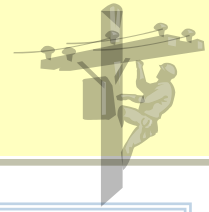

Annual Report

Chairman's Report

Mr. Blair Hamilton reported on some of the more significant happenings of the past year. He discussed the progress of the Title Transfer Legislation, the submitting of a Lease of Power Privilege application to the Dept of Interior on the flow control structure at Diamond Fork, the progress of the Crab Creek power station using the Spanish Fork City water line as the means for generation and applying for a Bureau of Reclamation Renewal Energy grant for Crab Creek. He also discussed his attendance at CREDA meetings and the information received there such as the criteria that determine the release of water from Lake Powell. He expressed his appreciation to the Board for their support and backing in all these projects.

H.E.A.T Assistance

The Home Energy Assistance Target program, known as H.E.A.T., is a federally-funded energy assistance program. The goal of the program is to assist eligible individuals and families meet the higher costs of energy during the winter months. Low-income families with young children, elderly and disabled residents of Utah, Wasatch and Summit Counties can apply for one-time assistance. The program begins November 1, 2011 and runs through March 31, 2012. Because this program provides one-time assistance, it is important for families and individuals to do all they can to keep their utility bills current and to conserve energy. Manager's Report

Dan Ellsworth, SESD's General Manager, reported on SESD's mission as a Public Power Provider and commented as follows. "Public power utilities have a greater sense of community service. In doing so, it is becoming more and more apparent we are traveling in the right direction."

POWER OUTAGES

Most outages results in customers being without power for an hour or two. Some outages, like what recently happened in Davis County, may result in customers being without power for several days. These types of outages require power users to be prepared to minimize the impact of the outage on you and your family. SESD would like to suggest that you have an outage kit on hand. Outage kits should include items such as: battery-operated flashlights, alarm clocks and radios; water; non-perishable foods; and manual can openers. During a power outage, you should also turn off or unplug any major appliances or sensitive electronic equipment. This will prevent overloads when power is restored and it may also protect your appliances or equipment from any resulting power surges.

REBATE PROGRAM Home Energy Savings Program

SESD has partnered with UAMPS (Utah Associated Municipal Power Systems) to offer cash incentives to customers who purchase energy efficient appliances and lighting fixtures from participating retailers. As of August 2011, SESD has issued over \$3,300.00 in rebates to our customers.
