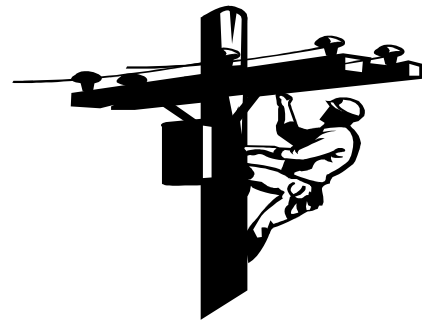

Let's "Get Greener" together.



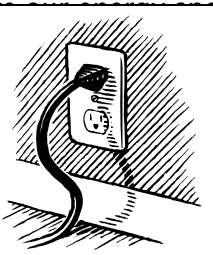

1. Replace as many incandescent light bulbs in your home as possible with compact fluorescent light bulbs.

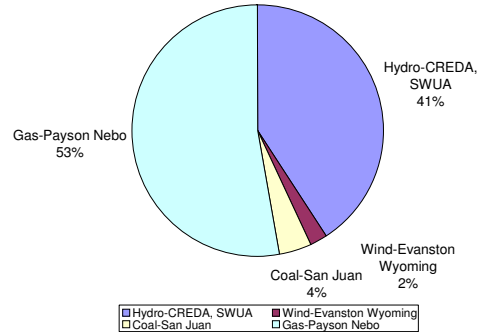
Residential customers of the SESD service area can purchase CFL's for cost at the SESD office. You can also bring your used CFL's to our office for recycling.

2. Take advantage of an Energy Audit offered to SESD customers once a year.

Have a specialist conduct a detailed energy audit. Now that it's warming up, be sure to check any cold weather accessories that may still be plugged in. Heat tape, animal heaters, trough heaters etc... Efficient steps at home and at work and make an important difference.



SESD POWER RESOURCES



SESD's resources as listed above are those for which SESD has contractual rights and shows our commitment to diversification and green power. Currently SESD receives hydro generation from Federal hydro-power facilities which include projects on the Colorado River, the Provo River and the Strawberry Project water system. We have wind generation from a wind farm in Evanston, Wyoming, coal generation from the San Juan Generating facility in the four corners area and the Nebo Power Station which is a natural gas generation plant in Payson. SESD is committed to meet the needs of all our customers, present and future, with an investment in more environmentally friendly resources.

In an effort to increase our ability to purchase or contract for additional wind power, SESD is in the process of developing a green power rate.

We encourage our customers to become involved in an effort to be *energy smart*, to understand their own usage patterns, to conserve resources, to ask questions. Together we can learn and grow.
